


1. If you learn all of these notes you can now play the same notes as the ones on the xylophone, even the extra keys (Bb, F# & C#).
















Batter Up

2. Recorder baseball is a fun way to learn the

notes on your recorder.

Start by dividing the class into two teams and making three bases and a home plate. Make up cards with the notes on a stave and choose a referee.

Team one can now send their first player up to the place. The referee can now pick out a note at random and show it to the batter. If they can play the note on their recorder, they can move to first base. The next team member comes up to the plate and if that player makes it to first base. He or she pushes the first person to second base. Once as player gets pushed around to home plate, their team gets a point.

If a player does not get the note right, that is an 'OUT' and the player sits down. If there are three 'OUTs' it is the other teams turn to bat.
